

2009 University Women's Club Scholarships

Scholarship Description

The University Women's Club is an organization comprised of the wives of faculty and staff, and female faculty and staff. Each spring, the University Women's Club awards \$1,000 scholarships to deserving students, in honor of the wives of past presidents of the University of Florida, as well as wives of distinguished campus leaders. Each of these ladies has served the University during her husband's career at the University of Florida, and their service is being recognized by the University Women's Club through the Scholarship Awards. A description of each award is available at www.dso.ufl.edu/scholarships/uwc. Students only need to submit one application to be considered for all of the awards. Completed applications are due by February 24th at 4:30 p.m., in the Dean of Students Office, 202 Peabody Hall.

Scholarship Requirements

To be considered for a 2009 UWC Scholarship, applicants must comply with all of the following requirements:

- Have a minimum 3.6 GPA
- Be enrolled as a full-time undergraduate student in the 3rd or 4th year of their program
- Provide demonstrated service to the university and/or community (Previous recipients are not eligible.)
- Please see the descriptions of each award for any additional requirements.

Application Checklist

The following items must be submitted in ONE packet by 4:30p.m., on February 24th, to the Dean of Students Office in 202 Peabody Hall:

- Five copies** of the completed scholarship application, answering all questions below and on the following page.
- Two letters** of recommendation in sealed envelopes, including one from a community service agency with which you have worked.
- One original plus four copies** of an official transcript from the University of Florida.

Incomplete application packets will not be considered.

Application Questions

Please address the following questions typewritten on a separate page:

1. Essay Question: Please describe your goals for your future, the community, and others. In particular, what are your goals for the next five years? Ten years? How will this award help you achieve those goals?
2. List your campus and/or community service activities and positions held. Note hours per week devoted to activities.
3. List your academic achievements and awards, as well as participation in extracurricular activities. Begin with national awards and achievements, followed by state, local and college-level awards. Awards include certificates, plaques, monetary awards, etc.
4. Include an employment history of current and recent jobs you have held. Include the employer's name and address, dates of employment, and approximate hours per week worked at each position.

THE EDITH BRISTOL TIGERT SCHOLARSHIP

Given annually to students currently classified as juniors, in recognition of excellent scholarship (3.6 minimum GPA), responsible leadership, and for service to the University and/or community.

THE RITA McTIGUE O'CONNELL SCHOLARSHIPS

Given annually to students who are at least in the first semester of his/her senior year, in recognition of excellent scholarship (3.6 minimum GPA), responsible leadership, and for service to the University and/or community.

THE RITA O'CONNELL SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Two scholarships given annually to undergraduate/graduate students who have, in spite of material and continuing physical or cognitive disability, not only achieved success as students, but also demonstrated those traits of character and personal qualities of perseverance and indomitable spirit, which are likely to inspire other students with disabilities to reach their academic and personal goals.
