Now that she is trying to register for a Physics class they are all full. Her roommate says that some students hold classes for others. I just want to know if this is true and what can my daughter do to get to a Physics class if none open up.

LOBBY	mom3kvt	mom3kvt: Are students able to see the number of open seats remaining in a course before their registration window opens?
LOBBY	titusfamilia4	titusfamilia4: Our son says that UF is requesting his transcript from last year before he can register for Spring classes! I'm a bit confused and certainly hoping that they will not hold him up. I have contacted the high school which is in New Delhi, but haven't received a response. As he is completing his first semester, I find it odd that admissions doesn't have that information on file.

LOBBY	familychatadministrator	familychatadministrator(NSFP_Yesenia): @DeLuege: Students who register at earlier times can hold courses for other students. If the Physics course is critical tracking and required for semester two than she will need to see an adviser to be placed in that course.

LOBBY	familychatadministrator	familychatadministrator(NSFP_Hannah): @bevyjean Most of the time it is not possible to hold classes for others because of the prerequisites required for each class (for instance, I cannot hold Calculus 3 for someone because I have not taken Calculus 2), but there are some classes that can be "held." It is a rare, circumstantial loophole that can't really be prevented with online registration.
LOBBY	PMcMaster	PMcMaster: Attending a summer session is that required and how do most students decide when and how often to enroll in summer?
LOBBY	familychatadministrator	familychatadministrator(NSFP_Yesenia): @PMcMaster:A minimum of 9 credit hours must be completed in order to graduate. It however, does not have to be at UF. It can be at another Florida university or state college. Usually students use summer as a way to catch up on classes they need to take or just to simply raise their GPA.
LOBBY	PMcMaster	PMcMaster: As the topic of off campus housing is starting to come up, are leases based on semesters, or sometimes include summer, and how is this best navigated? Lessons learned?

Some advantages to dropping a course is that it does not affect your GPA. A disadvantage is that if your student received bright futures they will need to pay them back for that course. Also, if you drop a critical tracking class you will need to take it to progress in your major.
