Prior Service/Credit

- Prior service/credit can count for MS1 and MS2 years of ROTC
- What qualifies:
 - Three to four years of JROTC (regardless of branch)
 - College level ROTC (regardless of branch)
 - Military Service (BCT)

- Full Tuition or Room & Board
 - Up to \$5000/semester (\$10000/year)
- Books: \$600 / semester (\$1200/year)

Service Commitment

- Active Duty: 4 years AD; 4 years USAR, NG or IRR
- National Guard: 6 years NG; 2 years IRR
- Army Reserve: 6 years USAR; 2 years IRR
- Total obligation is 8 years depending on Accessions Board
